Greetings from the Superintendent:

I was driving home the other night and it was so foggy that I actually appreciated the bank of snow on the side of the road which allowed me to gauge how close I was to the ditch. I have heard weather forecasters say the latest storm we had was the worst recorded in nearly twenty years and we may still see more snow before spring arrives. To date we have used five snow days of which two were built into the calendar. Since we are required by state statute to attend 174 days per year, we will have to make up the other three. January 18 was selected as our first make up date. I will be recommending to the Board of Education that we use February 15 and May 21 as the other two days. A new law was passed last year that requires school districts to build in six make-up days. Once a district has missed the first six, then they must make up one day for every two days missed until the total days equals ten. So a district could miss up to fourteen days and only be required to make up ten.

The Board of Education selected Universal Construction as our Construction Manager for the new Intermediate school. They have been

working with Tevis Architects to provide “value engineering” which will allow us to stay within budget throughout the construction phase. Although the District will not sell the bonds until April, there has been some activity on the Edgerton campus such as surveying, civil engineering, and core drilling. This pre-construction activity will help us identify the appropriate location for placement of the new building.

Tevis Architects will be holding a public meeting to show the plan designs and elevations of the proposed building on February 16. The meeting will begin at the Intermediate school in Edgerton at 5:30 p.m., then will proceed to the High School at 7:00 p.m. during the home basketball game. This school year a



leadership team consisting of fifteen staff members has been attending monthly meetings to learn what it takes to become a Professional Learning Community. Professional Learning Communities see student learning, not teaching, as their mission. Part of our focus this year is to insure the policies, instruction, curriculum, programs, professional development, and other functions of the school support student learning. Four questions that are paramount to becoming a Professional Learning Community are: What should students know and be able to do? How will the school determine that students have learned the essential knowledge and skills? How will the school respond when students do not learn? How will the school respond when they already know it? During the early dismissal days for inservice, all staff has been engaged in looking at student assessment data, developing vertical and horizontal teaming, and identifying ways to keep our focus on student learning.

The Governor will be addressing the condition of

the state budget during his State of the State address on January 20. There is speculation there will be another round of budget cuts that affect Elementary and Secondary education. In 1991 the North Platte R-I School District developed a plan to reduce spending which included staff cuts. Here it is, nineteen years later and we are again bracing ourselves for a shortfall of state aid. We have developed a three-tiered model that will guide us through any projected shortfall that exists. A part of our campaign promise was to pay off the remaining financial commitment on the high school. By eliminating this debt we will reduce our long-term liabilities, but at the same time we will reduce our carryover balances. As we progress into the 2010-2011 school year, we hope we can preserve the quality of education that is currently in place.
